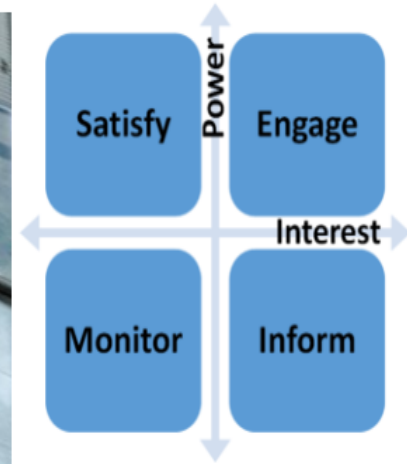
Eliminating the risk of project failure
